



Bridgewater School

By working closely with the landscape architect before work started on site, this project was constructed to provide the play area and equipment to the set budget.

The play areas were divided into two parts: the Sand and Wet Area and the Baby Garden.

The Baby Garden involved:

- Excavating into a steep slope
- Constructing a timber pole retaining wall
- Paving
- Constructing a sand pit
- Forming earth mounds
- Landscaping.

The Sand and Wet Areas were split by a tarmac path, which was formed by installing a sleeper retaining wall. On one side of the path was a pond and on the other a sand pit and a water rill.

Three weirs were strategically installed to allow the children to control the water flow and a fabric canopy was installed to cover the Sand and Wet Area.
